

Glossary

1%-percenter: Refers to the 1% of the human race who are immune to PTSD. Differentiated from psychopaths and sociopaths by their ability to pass the Empathy Deficit Disorder Test.

a thing (extraordinary categorization usage): Someone who is physically human, but who is metaphysically something else. Often referred to as “special.” Also Uber, Uber-powered, or Uber-enhanced. Formally, these superhumans are known as Wunderwaffen.

a tool (QAnon usage): A slur for a nonelite who, willingly and willfully, is a tool of the elite.

above my/your pay grade: A military expression which refers to something that is above the privy of a given person’s rank.

APC (military usage): An armored personnel carrier.

ASI (Additional Skill Identifier): ASI identify specialized skills, qualifications, and requirements that are closely related to and are in addition to those inherent to the MOS. ASI are authorized for use only with designated MOS and will be listed in each specification for such MOS.

BAU: The **Behavioral Analysis Unit (BAU)** is a department of the Federal Bureau of Investigation’s National Center for the Analysis of Violent Crime (NCAVC) that uses behavioral analysts to assist in criminal investigations. The mission of the NCAVC and the BAU is to provide behavioral based investigative and/or operational support by applying case experience, research, and training to complex and time-sensitive crimes, typically involving acts or threats of violence.

black operation: A proprietary or secret operation.

black project: A proprietary or secret project.

black site: A location at which an unacknowledged black operation or black project is conducted. It can be corporate or governmental.

blaster (military usage): A directed-energy weapon. A so-called raygun.

Bose-Einstein condensate (BEC): A ghost-like person/thing composed of bosons or bosonic particles resulting from ghosting, i.e., what a person/thing is composed of when ghosting. Colloquially known as ectoplasm.

CA (military usage): A civilian advisor.

Certified Protection Officer Program: The program is designed for security officers and law enforcement students who wish to learn more about security/asset protection. It is for the career-oriented individual. The difference between a guard and a Professional Security Officer is certification via this program by the IFPO.

CIA: The **Central Intelligence Agency (CIA)** known informally as **the Agency** and historically as **the Company**, is a civilian foreign intelligence service of the federal government of the United States.

CQB (close quarters battle): All forms of close-in fighting involving weapons, the contemporary iteration of which involves so-called small arms.

CQC (close quarters combat): All forms of hand-to-hand fighting.

closer: A professional assassin. Includes military snipers. A category of fixer.

CO (military usage): The Commanding Officer.

COB (military usage): The **chief of the boat (COB)** is an enlisted sailor on board a U.S. Navy submarine who serves as the senior enlisted advisor to both the Commanding Officer (CO) and Executive Officer (XO).

COB (space marine usage): The **chief of the boat (COB)** is an enlisted astronaut on board a space marine starship who serves as the senior enlisted advisor to both the Commanding Officer (CO) and Executive Officer (XO).

Columbian necktie: A Colombian necktie (Spanish: *corte de corbata, tie-cut*) is a form of execution or post-mortem mutilation in which the victim's tongue is pulled through a deep cut beneath the jaw and left dangling on the neck. It first appeared in Colombia during the period known as La Violencia (1948–1958) as a method of psychological warfare designed to scare and intimidate.

Cookie (military usage): A common nickname for a boat's main cook. The vessel in question is usually a submarine or a starship.

CPO (close protection officer): A CPO, more commonly known as a bodyguard or close, is employed to protect the life/lives of a Principal and or a Principal's family from theft, attack, injury, or harm. Other terms include executive protection and VIP protection.

CSAR: Combat search and rescue (**CSAR**) are search and rescue operations that are carried out during war that are within or near combat zones.

CSI: The job title **Crime Scene Investigator** is one of many that describe individuals who discover, document, and preserve all pieces of evidence at the scene of a crime.

DIA: The **Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA)** is an intelligence agency and combat support agency of the United States Department of Defense, specializing in defense and military intelligence.

DSC (Disposable Synthetic for Combat): DSC look human enough, but they are stronger and much more durable than mundanes. The shiny new penny in the art of war.

elite (QAnon usage): When A person who exercises disproportionate power and influence. It is customary to distinguish between political elites, whose locations in powerful institutions, organizations, and movements enable them to shape or influence political outcomes, often decisively, and cultural elites, who enjoy a high status and influence in nonpolitical spheres such as arts and letters, philanthropy, professions, and civic associations. At the national level, in all but the largest countries, political elites number only a few thousand persons, whereas the makeup of cultural elites is more indeterminate and turns on the nonpolitical spheres regarded as consequential in a society.

EXO: All forms of self-aware, form-fitting, AI-powered suits of armor. Snug, ballistic protection from a “smart” wearable that is akin to a hi-tech militarized scuba driver’s gloved-and-booted wetsuit. Made of a flexible plasticine polymer that looks and feels like neoprene; a material formally-known as antiballistic-neoprene, and colloquially-known as neoprene as if it were “regular” non-antiballistic neoprene. As such, the wearer (aka the driver) looks like they’ve been dipped in liquid rubber, from the neck down. A seamless fusion of rubber gloves, boots, and wetsuit, resulting in full one-piece coverage, from the neck down—i.e., an antiballistic catsuit. In the Ancient World, soldiers of Genghis Kahn’s Mongolian Empire wore satin as ballistic protection against arrows.

FBI: The **Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI)** is the domestic intelligence and security service of the United States and its principal federal law enforcement agency.

fire-breathing Dragon (military usage): Also, Dragon or dragon. An ICBM carrying nuclear munitions. An “atomic” missile.

fixer: A professional who resolves “problems” for public, private, and/or governmental institutions. Includes closers and LEOs.

FOB: A forward operating base (FOB) is any secured forward operational level military position, commonly a military base, that is used to support strategic goals and tactical objectives. A FOB may contain an airfield, hospital, machine shop, or other logistical facilities. The base may be used for an extended period of time. FOBs are traditionally supported by main operating bases that are required to provide backup support to them. A FOB also improves reaction time to local areas as opposed to having all troops on the main operating base.

fox-body: A Holtzmann-drive-powered starship.

FTL: All forms of Faster-than-light (also superluminal or supercausal) travel and communication are the conjectural propagation of matter or information faster than the speed of light.

ghosting: Formally known as **Bose-Einstein spectral emulation (BESE)**. A protocol which selectively enables two extraordinary states of existence for a person/thing that render obsolete all forms of ordinary defensive systems including force-fields. **1.** Apparition, i.e., a person/thing can be seen by ordinary means, but cannot be touched by ordinary means. An apparition is also referred to as a spook. **2.** Ghost, i.e., a person/thing cannot be seen or touched by ordinary means. A ghost is also referred to as 2nd-generation stealth or cloaking.

Holtzmann drive: A drive which allows a starship to successfully traverse fold space, enabling faster-than-light travel. The drive was invented by NASA.

Holtzmann shield: A Class-A forcefield deriving from Phase One of the suspensor-nullification effect. Commonly referred to as simply a shield. The shield was invented by NASA.

ICBM: An intercontinental ballistic missile.

IFPO: The International Foundation for Protection Officers.

KZ (military usage): The kill zone.

LEO: A law enforcement officer.

LZ (military usage): The landing zone.

MO (modus operandi): A Latin phrase meaning “mode of operating,” is an identifying characteristic or behavioral pattern that law enforcement uses to identify somebody through the way they commit a crime. It’s how investigators begin the luminary process of narrowing down the field of potential suspects based on whether or not the details of the crime fits their “modus operandi.”

It’s definitely important to note that some characteristics of an MO can change over time. However, the basic characteristics of a consistent method often remain, and can be a reliable indicator as to if a suspect could be connected.

There are some cases where the MO is so distinctive and unique that it is the only evidence required to identify who committed the crime.

MOS (Military Occupational Specialty): A United States military occupation code, or a military occupational specialty code (MOS code), is a nine-character code used in the United States Army and United States Marine Corps to identify a specific job. In the United States Air Force, a system of Air Force Specialty Codes (AFSC) is used.

MP: The Military Police (MOS 31B).

mundane (extraordinary categorization usage): A person who has not been enhanced—e.g., an “ordinary” human being.

NAVCOM A.I. (also nav-comm): The navigation-communication artificial intelligence which allows a starship to successfully navigate folded space. It is also used for FTL communication. The nav-comm was invented by The Boeing Company.

NASA: The **National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA /'næsə/)** is an independent agency of the U.S. federal government responsible for the civil space program, aeronautics research, and space research. Established in 1958, it succeeded the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics (NACA) to give the U.S. space development effort a distinctly civilian orientation, emphasizing peaceful applications in space science.

NDA: A **non-disclosure agreement (NDA)**, also known as a **confidentiality agreement (CA)**, **confidential disclosure agreement (CDA)**, **proprietary information agreement (PIA)**, or **secrecy agreement (SA)**, is a legal contract or part of a contract between at least two parties that outlines confidential material, knowledge, or information that the parties wish to share with one another for certain purposes, but wish to restrict access to. Doctor–patient confidentiality (physician–patient privilege), attorney–client privilege, priest–penitent privilege and bank–client confidentiality agreements are examples of NDAs, which are often not enshrined in a written contract between the parties.

nonelite (QAnon usage): Not a member of the elite.

P0: Earth.

Pandora: Saturn’s moon.

pass-thru also known as ghost-thru: An apparition or ghost can nondestructively pass through an “ordinary” object, i.e., it can pass through a person or thing that is in an ordinary state of existence, and do so in a nondestructive manner.

PMC: A private military contractor aka independent military contractor aka a mercenary.

PO: A patrol officer.

POV: POV stands for point of view. For example, on TikTok, POV is often used in videos or as a hashtag to indicate that the video is meant to be watched as if the viewer were present or the viewer is in a specific situation.

profiler (law enforcement usage): A person who records and analyzes someone’s psychological and behavioral characteristics, so as to assess or predict their capabilities or to assist in identifying categories of people. For example, psychological profilers are being used to help officers build a picture of the attacker.

PSO: A professional security officer.

PTSD: Post-traumatic stress disorder is an anxiety disorder that can result from a traumatic event. A term often used in relation to the military, it can also apply to survivors of any type of trauma, including sexual violence. Survivors might experience uncharacteristic feelings of stress, fear, anxiety, and nervousness—and this is perfectly normal. With PTSD, these feelings are extreme, can cause you to feel constantly in danger, and make it difficult to function in everyday life.

QAnon: QAnon (/ˈkjuːənɒn/ KYOO-ə-non, /ˈkjuːænɒn/ KYOO-a-non) is a political movement that originated in the American far-right. QAnon centers on claims made by an anonymous individual or individuals known as “Q”. Those claims are relayed and developed by online communities and influencers. Their core belief is that a cabal of Satanic, cannibalistic child molesters are operating a global child sex trafficking ring which conspires against Donald Trump. QAnon has direct roots in Pizzagate, an Internet conspiracy theory that incorporates elements of many other theories. QAnon has been described as a cult, by its detractors.

reston tank: A tank used for tissue regeneration. Despite its highly regenerative properties, some individuals harbor negative feelings towards the reston substance itself, finding its viscosity somewhere between liquid and slime. Additionally, most reston patients feel as if they're being swallowed alive upon being submerged in the substance.

ROE: The rules of engagement.

SARMs: Used by troops on both sides during the Martian Race Wars resulting in “super soldiers.” Colloquially known as stimms, “the next step in human evolution.” SARMs are **performance-enhancing agents that stimulate anabolism (increase muscle mass and strength) and facilitate recovery from exercise.** SARMs are not anabolic steroids; rather, they are synthetic ligands that bind to androgen receptors (ARs). Prolong abuse is been known to cause Dissociative Identify Disorder in a percentage of users.

SLMPD: The St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department.

space marine: A spacefaring merchant marine.

special policing: A police officer, who is also a certified protection officer, used by a private business or a governmental entity as a security guard. Usually, this individual is not bound by ROE, in the execution of their job.

tessmacher (military usage): A specific type of military-grade blaster. Because it is a WMD, it is classified as a hand-held WMD when it's in its small arms and light weapons forms.

USSF: The United States Space Force.

Virtual helmet system: The VHS is Sony's Betamax, with integrated virtual tactical display, and 360-degree coverage—a display visible only to that specific driver because it's beamed directly into their brain although it appears to be an external 360-degree holographic image that's been networked into the AI of their armor suit's personal Shield generator. Full LINK buffer. Ultra-K resolution. This VHS provides drivers with unprecedented situational awareness.

VIP: A very important person.

WMD: A weapon of mass destruction.

XO (military usage): The Executive Officer. A second-in-command officer.

xxxxxxx-something: For example, twenty-something—i.e., someone who is in their twenties or looks like they are in their twenties.
